What information do we need to know?

The more information you can provide the more it can help so please provide any or all of the following when you report your rabbits:

- Rabbit numbers
- Rabbit locations (map or GPS location are best)
- Rabbit damage (i.e. to vegetation)
- Rabbit warrens and burrows (numbers, locations, and whether active with live rabbits or abandoned)

Even one rabbit sighted in a district is important to know about.
